

PRICELESS LOCKE FAMILY IMAGES FROM THE PAST


Recently I revisited my Locke archives, and found many photographs that had never been featured in any of the previous Newsletters. All of these images are from the descendants of Jesse McCullough Locke (1793-1869) and his wife Mary Agnes Hunter (1797-1864). Jesse moved his family from Chester County, South Carolina, to an area near Chattanooga around 1832, following his brother, **Joseph** (1796-circa 1855) to a new life.

Three of Jesse's sons married sisters from the **Rogers** family. **James Henry** (1818-1899) married Matilda, Jesse Culp (1822-1892) married Elizabeth, and Benjamin McCullough (1836-1865) married Martha.
















Benjamin McCullogh Locke, left, born 1861, was the son of Jesse Culp (1822-1892) and Margaret Fletcher Locke. (His son was Owen Thompson). Benjamin Franklin "Ben Frank" (1861-1946), next, was the youngest son of James Henry Locke (1818-1899), and Matilda Rogers. Eutoka Locke Lee (b. 1865), next, was a daughter of James Henry Locke. John Coffee Hayes Locke (1854-1925) with wife, Julia Reynolds (1866-1946), was a son of James Henry Locke and his wife, Matilda Rogers (1825-1888).



Pages from the **John Coffee Hayes Locke** (1855-1929) and Cynthia Lenora Bloomer (1860-1918), Family Bible. There were two Lockes with this same name. This Locke was the son of Jesse Culp Locke (1822-1892) and Elizabeth Frances Rogers. Enlarge the page to read the detail.



Leopold Locke (1875-1954), was a son of Jesse Culp Locke (1822-1892), and his second wife, Margaret Fletcher Davis (b. 1841). **Nathaniel Locke** (1905-1970), next, was a son of John Coffee Hayes Locke and Cynthia Lenora Bloomer. **James Buchanan Locke** (1883-1941), was the eldest son of John and Cynthia Locke. He married his first wife, "Mimmie" Pennington (1889-1919), in 1904.







Bertie Doris (1909-1993) and Samuel Devader "Bud" Locke (1913-1965), were the only children of James and Mimmie who survived to adulthood. That's Adelle in the center, who died within a year of this photograph in 1917. That's Doris and Bud with their dad after their mother had died. A brother, Hogan, had passed in 1918, at age two, just a month before his mother. Most likely they were all victims of the Flu epidemic. Bud was killed in a plane crash over India in 1965.









These are the four children of Judson Lafayette Locke (1856-1919) and Sallie McKensie. Judson was the son of James Henry, and brother to John Coffee, Ben Frank, and Eutoka, pictured earlier. He was also the younger brother of Jesse R. Locke, pictured next. That's Judson Adoniram "Jake" Locke (1881-1966) on the left, with older brother John William Henry (b. 1878) to his right. Linda Lee "Linnie" Locke (1884-1973) is next, with Rosa Lena Locke (1886-1915) to her right.



Jesse R. Locke (1853-1943) was the oldest son of James Henry and Matilda Rogers Locke. That's Jesse with wife, Alice Jane Johnson (1865-1956), on the far left. To the right is one of their sons, Victor Locke (1889-1970) with his wife, Winnie Mae Brewer (1892-1961).










Hannah Thompson Anderson, left, was the granddaughter of Benjamin McCullough Locke (born 1861), and the only daughter of Locke's oldest son, Robert Owen Thompson (born 1880). Burnice (BURN'ice) Harris is a great-grandson to Benjamin through his mother, Mary Thompson Harris. That's Burnice with his Aunt Hannah, and Burnice in the 60's. On the right, is Burnice's late older brother, Michael Ray Harris.

LOCKE BURIAL GROUND IN ST. MARY'S COUNTY, MARYLAND

This is the only photographic record of actual Locke burials near the plantation of Philip Lock on this narrow peninsula between the Potomac and Pawtuxent Rivers. One marker identifies Dr. William Henry Locke, and Rebecca Locke, who was probably his wife, and also Virginia Locke and Charles Locke, who might have been their children. A large stone cross is at the center of the plot. The inscription on the cross reads, "The remains of all lie buried on the Locke estate on the State Road except the remains of Wm. H. Locke, M.D., who was buried in the Congressional Cemetery, and the remains of Charles S. Braddock who sleeps in the soil of Virginia having given his life to the Confederate cause in the War Between the States."


